

The Purpose

The Bakhita School of Excellence was officially founded in 2023 by BETTER (Building East Timor Through Education/Resources) in partnership with the Diocese of Dili. The parties came together with the vision of providing an international standard of education that is accessible to all those in Timor irrespective of their location or economic situation.

The Timor Leste Strategic Plan 2011-2030 uses the word "education" 273 times in its 228-page document and states "the true wealth of any nation is in the strength of its people*."

This is further supported by the long-term vision of Timor-Leste, "By 2030, the people of Timor-Leste will be educated and knowledgeable, able to live long and productive lives, and have access to a quality education that will allow them to participate in the economic, social and political development of our nation*."

In Timor-Leste, 70% of students fail to meet basic year one learning outcomes and 58% of Timorese left or never attended school. With a young population where 50% are 19 years old or younger, education is a pathway out of poverty and into prosperity. This is a shared belief by BETTER, the Diocese and the Government.

The Bakhita School of Excellence set out to improve the status quo with the aspiration to set a new national standard of education in Timor-Leste that will lift these statistics to international standards.

The strategic plan holds true to the objectives of the Timor-Leste Government and the Catholic values on which it was established, and at the same time is innovative and bold as it pursues its transformative aspiration for the future of education in Timor-Leste.

The intent is clear and underpinned by the six goals that signal the priorities, key values and future actions. The Bakhita School of Excellence is centred on providing a new standard of education, creating responsible global citizens who don't only learn for themselves.

This strategic plan is a foundation document that frames future actions and the intended future direction. The Bakhita School of Excellence will be relentless in striving to be a leader in education, characterised by its Catholic identity, creating a global vision that inspires hope.

Responsible global citizens who don't just learn for themselves but for their country at large	Delivery of the curriculum with a grounding in practical education in which learners see the importance of their education not only for themselves but for their country, whilst sharing what they learn among the community.
Supporting learners to achieve academic and personal excellence	Regular check-ins with learners and teachers to check progress in line with the academic scope and sequence, curriculum and general well-being.

Formation of the school community in the Catholic tradition	Formation of parents and students as part of school enrolment.
Strengthen Catholic values	Integration of values academically through the teaching of Religion as a subject. Integration of values practically in how education is delivered and how the school community treat each other.
Continued spiritual development	All staff and students continuing their spiritual development through daily prayer and monthly school community mass. School support in preparing students for sacraments.

Strategic Objectives	Actions to be Taken
Recruitment of high-quality staff	Recruitment and selection processes will be further developed to attract and select high quality staff. Working conditions and remuneration are conducive to retaining staff.
Teaching staff demonstrate 21st century teaching practices including the use of technology	Professional learning including micro-credentialed courses will be provided to teachers in order to develop their teaching practices and integrate technology in the classroom effectively.
Staff professional development with leadership development	Continued mentorship of the staff through the leaders of the school and with the BETTER team in Australia to support staff growth professionally and personally. Current and future leadership is identified and nurtured.

Strategic Objectives	Actions to be Taken
Undertake capital projects that expand the school to its target 52 classrooms and supporting infrastructure	Refurbish and construct capital projects needed to support progressively built school and ensure sustainable practices in development.
Develop school facilities and procure resources to enhance educational outcomes and 21st century learning	Continually review master plan to ensure proposed facilities are in line with improved educational outcomes. Equip all teachers with a laptop and ensure classes have sufficient IT devices to enhance 21st century learning.
Ensure the facilities and resources of the school are properly maintained to ensure long-term sustainability	Hiring of sufficient maintenance and cleaning staff to ensure the facilities are maintained to high standard to ensure sustainability.

Governance & Sustainability

Ensuring the future of the school through strong governance and culture of accountability and stewardship within the national and Catholic structures.

Strategic Objectives	Actions to be Taken
To develop strong governance within the Board	Conduct at least 4 meetings per year with the board of the school.
Instil a culture of accountability and stewardship within the community	Integration of parent contributions to the school as part of the enrolment acceptance process. Engagement and learning of parents as the students' first teachers in life and continued support of their children's education.
To protect the long-term future of the school and proactive financial management and planning	Responsible actions regarding fees, BETTER's funding and long-term responsibilities as the school plans to be returned to the Parish in full.
